


- A MSU College of Human Medicine, 200 E. First Street, Flint 48502 Tours: 10:30 a.m., 11:00 a.m., 11:30 a.m., Noon, 12:30 p.m., 1:00 p.m., and 1:30 p.m.

 (Open 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.) Located in the former Flint Journal building, the medical school anchors a "Health and Wellness" district in the city's downtown. There are also 16 luxury loft apartments. Today, enjoy a tour of the 1st floor with historical background information from 1924-2017.
- B MTA Downtown Transportation Center, E. Second Street, Flint 48502 (Open 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) A state of the art facility that includes unique art by local artists.
- © Ennis Center for Children, 129 E. Third Street, Flint 48502 (Open 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) Ennis Center for Children (ECC) is a foster care and adoption agency. Stop by for some popcorn and refreshments and discuss the opportunities to join ECC's team as a foster/adoptive parent/family.

 (Open 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.) Local artisans will be selling handcrafted wares, including jewelry, garden art, purses, pottery and more on First Street between Stevens and Wallenberg. There will also be crafts for kids.
- Ferris Wheel Building, 615 S.  (Open Noon to 6:00 p.m.) Opened in 1994, walk through one of the most beautiful buildings in Flint with its three-story glass atrium and several permanent and rotating displays that represent the history of Flint & Genesee such as Gov. Henry Howland Crapo (Flint businessman and 14th governor of Michigan), the beginning of UM-Flint, student research and documents from the GHCC dealing with Flint History.
- (Open 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.) Visit UM-Flint's recreation center, 401 Mill Street, Flint 48502 (Open 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.) Visit UM-Flint's recreation center that features an indoor track, pool, spa, weight room, cardio room, fitness classes and more. The Recreation Center is open to the public through memberships, day passes, specialty fitness classes and youth camps as well as free to currently enrolled UM-Flint students with an MCard.



 (Open 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) The Food Bank of Eastern Michigan opened the Hunger Solution Center in 2015 to increase access to nutritional and healthy foods. The Food Bank distributed 26 Million pounds of food, including 9 Million pounds of fresh produce, to over 331,000 food insecure individuals last year. Assisting the Food Bank in its mission are 417 partner agencies; 8,500 volunteers; and numerous feeding programs across 22 counties in Eastern Michigan. Tours available throughout the day.

Kearsley Street, Flint 48503 (Open 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.)The Flint Public Library is home to an extensive reference department, research collections, local history and genealogy collections and 50,000 volume Children's Library. Enjoy the daylong Michigan Storytellers Festival at the Library with many programs throughout the day culminating in an evening concert of storytelling from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. All events are free.

The world-renowned collection now exceeds 8,000 objects. Visit their current exhibition, Rodin: The Human Experience Selections from the Iris and B. Gerald Cantor Collections (on view through July 30), in addition to the works available for viewing in their permanent galleries. Located near Hurley Hospital at 5th and Begole streets, Flint 48503

(Open 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) The Edible Flint Demonstration Garden is used to demonstrate accessibility practices, gardening techniques and unique garden designs. The space is also home to a variety of public workshops. All produce grown is donated to the community.

Durant-Dort Factory One, 303 W. Water Street, Flint 48503 (Open 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) Originally established in 1886 as the Flint Road Cart Co., this historic Flint GM plant, referred to as the American automaker's birthplace and epicenter of the global auto industry, is open for business after four years of restorations. Tours include the conference and event space along with the GM carriage-building/vehicle-manufacturing archive collection containing about 100,000 historical documents, photos and other artifacts related to Flint's GM history. Tours available throughout the day.


Factory Two, 129 N. Grand Traverse Street, Flint 48503 (Open 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) Get a tour of this new facility in Flint offering 14,000 sq. feet of maker space featuring a laser cutter, wood shop, metal shop, screen printing area, electronic lab and more. Tours available throughout the day.

Stockton Center at Spring Grove Museum, 720 Ann Arbor Street, Flint 48503 (Open 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) Col. Thomas Stockton formed an Independent Regiment to fight in the Civil War, which was later recognized as the 16th Michigan. He and his wife, Maria Smith, had this home built after his retirement. The house later became the first St. Joseph Hospital in Flint. Today's tours run every 30 minutes.

(Open 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.) Browse through used books, vinyl records, CDs, DVDs, magazines, t-shirts and more. - B Powers Catholic High School, 1505 W. Court Street, Flint 48503 (1) (Open 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.) This newly renovated school offers a unique experience for families who appreciate the value of a dynamic, faith-based education.
- Knob Hill Bed & Breakfast, 1105 South Drive, Flint 48503 10 (Open 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) Be entranced, be romantic, be yourself or just simply be at Knob Hill Bed & Breakfast. Learn about the history of the UAW through videos and a park tour.

University Avenue, Flint 48504 (April 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.) Home to over 50 exhibits designed for children ages 1-10 to inspire a lifelong love for learning through exploration and hands-on play! The museum's revolving exhibit, Discovery Zone, currently features a "Busy Builders" theme with extra-large building materials, such as arm-length Lincoln Logs.
